farms around Lexington, three major racecourses, the best equine vets in the world, the world thoroughbred registery, and so much more. Elaborate horse stables and complex stallion barns designed gentlemen farmers dot this pastoral landscape. KENTUCKY'S BOURBON TRAIL A BLUEGRASS TRADITION







Like their horses, Kentucky bourbon also benefits from the limestone filtered water. eliminating harsh the iron particles. It is what gives bourbon its distinctively sweet taste. All bourbon must be 51% corn and aged in new, charred-oak barrels. It is the aging process that gives each brand its character and color. Air circulation and placement in the warehouse all factor into the wide variety of subtle flavors. Dating back to 1805 the historic architecture of this industry adds to the mystique of the current bourbon boom. Kentucky has 73 licensed distilleries. Maker's Mark is the oldest and Buffalo Trace has been in operation the longest, having been the only one open during the Prohibition. Woodford Reserve is one of the top award winners. The future is changing as Kentucky Owl, one of Kentucky's newest distilleries, is transforming a 420-acre quarry into a modern campus.
