

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


Ohio's 60+ Population by County

SCRIPPS Ohio's 60+ Projected Population by County



Background Senior-Services Tax Levies

- OAA has been essentially flat funded since 1980
- Ohio no statewide home care program and strict Medicaid eligibility
- HCBS funding primarily through Medicaid very low income and very high disability
- Majority of states have developed supplemental programs for HCBS for older people





Ohio Levy History

- A woman in small Ohio county goes on a quest to develop a senior center and services in the mid 1970's
- Lobby's legislature and Governor for change in state law to allow county property tax levies for senior services
- Ohio now one of 14 states that funds senior services through local tax levies
- Ohio generates more dollars then all of the rest combined
- Sometimes one person can make a difference!

Ohio Levy Update

- 73 counties with levies—70 county-wide
- Estimate \$160 million annually in funds generated
- Median levy \$530,000 mean \$1.8 million
- Range Vinton \$10K, Franklin Over \$30 Mill
- Operated by Area Agency or County Board on Aging
- Good politics

 95% passage rate- margin typically 70% or more

Ohio Levy Overview

- Programs directed toward individuals with moderate levels of disability and incomes
- Levy programs provide a range of services
 information, health screening, senior
 center support, congregate meals and a
 range of HCBS
- Largest service categories: homemaker, home delivered meals, emergency response systems, personal care, medical transportation, home repair.
