A recent road-trip to see the largest home in the country took me to Asheville, NC. In the 1890's George & Edith Vanderbilt hired Architect Richard Morris Hunt & Landscape Architect Frederick Law Olmstead to design this 175,000 SF (4 acres) "summer home" on the original

BLUE RIDGE MOUNTAINS

Extending 550 miles southwest from Pennsylvania to Georgia, the Blue Ridge Mountains are part of the eastern side of the Appalachian Mountains. Their famous bluish color comes from the isoprene released into the atmosphere by the trees. The temperate climate supports thick forests of oak, hickory and fir trees, and over 700 species of flora and fauna. Mt. Mitchell is the highest peak east of the Mississippi River at 6,684 feet. The Blue Ridge Mts. are home


